



# Saline Board of Equalization Minutes



## SALINE COUNTY BOARD OF EQUALIZATION

The regular meeting of the Saline County Board of Equalization was called to order at 9:15 a.m. on Tuesday, January 22<sup>nd</sup>, 2019, by Chairperson, Marvin A. Kohout. The meeting opened with the Pledge of Allegiance. Present were Kohout, Janet J. Henning, Stephanie A. Krivohlavek, Philip S. Hardenburger and Russ Karpisek, Commissioners, Deputy County Clerk Anita Bartels, and Administrative Assistant Tim McDermott.

Notice of said meeting was posted in the County Clerk's Office, on the Saline County Website, and published in all County newspapers prior to the meeting, in compliance with State Statutes.

Let the record show that all proceedings are electronically recorded.

Kohout advised those present of the open meetings law posted at the back of the room.

Henning moved to approve the agenda as presented, seconded by Karpisek. Voting aye were Krivohlavek, Henning, Hardenburger, Kohout and Karpisek, nays none, motion carried.

Krivohlavek moved to approve the minutes of the January 8<sup>th</sup>, 2019 meeting as presented, seconded by Karpisek. Voting aye were Hardenburger, Karpisek, Henning, Krivohlavek and Kohout, nays none, motion carried.

Under correspondence, Kohout reports there will be two tax foreclosure sales on February 6, 2019.

County Assessor Brandi Kelly presented two Tax Exemption Applications, one for New Haven Baptist Church and one for JW Congregation Support, Inc. Kelly recommended the approval of both of these Tax Exemption Applications at a later date. No action was taken.

At 9:25 a.m., Henning moved to open the Public Hearing for Vehicle Exemptions, seconded by Krivohlavek. Voting aye were Karpisek, Krivohlavek, Kohout, Henning and Hardenburger, nays none, motion carried.

County Treasurer Debbie Spanyers presented a vehicle exemption application from the Schoenstatt Sisters of Mary for a 2009 Toyota Sedan. This vehicle is used exclusively for religious purposes, and is a renewal.

Spanyers then presented a vehicle exemption application from Doane College for their fleet of vehicles. These vehicles are used exclusively for educational purposes, and are all renewals.

At 9:30 a.m., Henning moved to close the Public Hearing, seconded by Krivohlavek. Voting aye were Kohout, Hardenburger, Krivohlavek, Karpisek and Henning, nays none, motion carried.

Henning moved to approve the vehicle exemption applications for the Schoenstatt Sisters of Mary and for Doane College, seconded by Krivohlavek. Voting aye were Krivohlavek, Henning, Hardenburger, Kohout and Karpisek, nays none, motion carried.

There being no further business to come before the Board, the meeting was adjourned at 9:36 a.m. The next meeting will be on February 5<sup>th</sup>, 2019, at 9:15 a.m. in the Saline County Commissioners' Room, Courthouse, Wilber, NE.
